

Rapid Re-Housing Dashboard Methodology

- The timeframe for the dashboard is one year and is updated every quarter.
- Performance targets are consistent with the memorandum of understanding signed by All Home, United Way, King County, and the City of Seattle.
- The “Select Population” menu filters the results to show only data from RRH programs that are designated to serve Families, Single Adults, or Youth & Young Adults. The list of programs by population is included at the end of this document.

Measure	How Measure Is Calculated	Notes
How many households enrolled?	The number of households who enrolled in a RRH program during the timeframe.	
How many households were literally homeless?	The number of households who enrolled in a RRH program during the timeframe whose prior living situation was an emergency shelter, Safe Haven, or place not meant for habitation, divided by the total number of households who enrolled during the timeframe.	
How many households moved into housing?	The number of households who are enrolled in a RRH program who have a Residential Move-In Date recorded in HMIS during the timeframe.	
How long did households spend searching for housing?	The average number of days between Enrollment Date and Residential Move-In Date for households with a Residential Move-In Date that falls during the timeframe.	
After moving in, how long did households receive assistance?	The average number of days between Residential Move-In Date and Exit Date for households with a Residential Move-In Date in HMIS and an Exit Date that falls during the timeframe.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Proxy measure for length of rental subsidy</i>
How long were households enrolled in RRH altogether?	The average number of days between Enrollment Date and Exit Date for households with an Exit Date that falls during the timeframe.	
How many households exited a RRH program?	The number of households who exited a RRH program during the timeframe.	
How many of them had moved into housing while enrolled in the program?	The number of households who exited a RRH program during the timeframe who had a Residential Move-In Date recorded in HMIS, divided by the total number who exited during that timeframe.	

How many households were permanently housed when they exited the program?	The number of households who exited any RRH program to permanent housing during the timeframe, divided by the total number who exited to any destination during that timeframe.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Permanent housing includes market rate housing, permanent supportive housing, and other subsidized housing</i>
How did household income change while enrolled in RRH?	For households who exited an RRH program during the timeframe, the average total monthly income at the time they exited the RRH program, compared to their total monthly income when they enrolled in the program.	
Of the households that exited RRH to permanent housing, how many became homeless again?	The number of households who exited a RRH program to permanent housing during the timeframe and returned to a shelter, transitional housing, or RRH program within the following 6, 12, or 24 months, divided by the total number who exited a RRH program to permanent housing during the timeframe.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Timeframe is 6 months earlier than the timeframe for the rest of the dashboard so all households exited the program at least 6 months ago.</i> • <i>Only includes households who consented to share their identifying information in HMIS.</i> • <i>These data cumulate over time, so the percent of returns may continue to grow as we approach the end of the return window.</i>
