| <b>Nominations of Lived Experience Community Members to Governing Committee</b> | <p>Colleen Echohawk and Felicia Salcedo provided context and outlined the process to date of seating the lived experience members to the Governing Committee.</p> <p>Facilitators, Amadeo Cruz Guiao and Becka Tilsen supported a conversation grounded in the Theory of Change to lead up to a Board vote, which included an additional 5 minutes of public comment. Motion to vote put forth: Accept the original slate of five candidates and support that the process was sufficient enough to meet the goals of seating the lived experience seats.

- 4 members voted for the motion
- 6 members voted against

**Next steps:**

All Home staff will consult with King County Boards and Commissions to put forth a process to re-review the original 51 candidates within 3 days for Board approval. The review process will include more individuals reviewing each application and interviews.

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
